Title: What is the best mask to go with now that mandates have been relaxed?

SYDNEY: The eastern states of Australia have eased up on mask mandates, meaning that we'll be seeing fewer masks as we go about our day. However, there are still a number of places where you'll need to ensure you can cover your nose and mouth with a face mask. Despite the new guidelines relaxing the mask laws, according to the NSW Government (https://www.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/stay-safe/rules/face-mask-rules), people over the age of 12 are required to wear masks in airports, in public hospitals or private health facilities, in residential care facilities or hostels, in indoor music festivals with more than 1,000 people, on public transport and public transport waiting areas (including in taxis and rideshare services), and on a domestic commercial aircraft (including when the aircraft is flying above NSW).

It has also been predicted that mask-wearing will continue long after the pandemic has ended (https://time.com/5952051/masks-after-pandemic-ends/) as we have been able to witness firsthand the benefits of mask wearing in preventing illness and virus transmission. Mask wearing as a cultural norm is already deeply embedded in Japanese culture going back over a century, which means they have had a lot more time to develop fashionable, comfortable, and effective masks.
