"Australia is facing a dog behaviour crisis," says George Tran, author of *Beyond Treats*. "We're seeing a direct correlation between behavioural challenges and the rising rates of surrender, euthanasia, and now attacks. Owners need better tools to address these problems."

Why "All Positive" Training Falls Short

The rise in dog-related incidents highlights the limitations of the "all positive," treat-based training philosophy. While treat training can reinforce simple commands, it often fails to address deeper behavioural issues like aggression, reactivity, and fear.

Studies such as those by Van Herwijnen et al. (2018) and Brubaker and Udell (2022) show that leadership-based methods—emphasising structure and trust—are more effective in fostering emotional stability and secure attachment in dogs.

"Treat-based training can mask underlying issues without resolving them," explains Tran. "It's like putting a Band-Aid on a wound that requires stitches. Leadership-based training gets to the root cause, creating lasting change."

A Better Way Forward with Leadership Training

Beyond Treats introduces dog owners to Tran's proven, evidence-based leadership methods through the compelling story of Emily and her dog, Buddy. Through relatable scenarios, the book equips owners with actionable strategies to:

- Build trust and respect with their dogs.
- Address challenging behaviours such as aggression and reactivity.
- Create a safe, balanced environment for dogs and their families.

"Leadership-based training is not about fear or dominance; it's about providing the guidance dogs need to feel secure," says Tran. "This is how we prevent the kinds of incidents that are landing people in hospitals and filling shelters with surrendered dogs."

The "Kindness Paradox" in Dog Training

Rigid adherence to "all positive" methods has contributed to what Tran calls the "kindness paradox," where compassion-driven approaches inadvertently lead to harm. When treat-based training fails, owners often label their dogs untrainable, leading to euthanasia or rehoming.

"Many of the dogs I work with are on their last chance," Tran shares. "Leadership-based training doesn't just save dogs—it saves families from heartbreak."
