The main aim of Champagne Divorce Club is to help women see a bright new future for themselves, explains Gillian.

"We want to see women back on their feet, loving themselves, and knowing that their divorce was just the start of an amazing new life for them - one they get to design themselves, where anything is possible.

"We want them to look back and recognise that, although it seemed devastating at the time, their divorce was actually the best thing that ever happened to them."
