"Eggy is a place where you can easily dump all of life's invisible "stuff" out of your head. You can store screenshots like recipes and manage calendar events like doctor's appointments as well as share grocery lists with your partner," said Kate.

The app recently received notable industry recognition by beating more than 300 other startups to <u>win a place</u> in prestigious Australian startup accelerator, <u>Startmate</u>. Backed by <u>Blackbird</u>, the biggest venture capital firm in Australia, the Startmate program aims to accelerate the country's most ambitious founders.
